- too + adjective/adverb: The bag is too heavy. / He drives too fast.
- too much + uncountable noun: too much homework, too much traffic
- too many + plural countable noun: too many mistakes, too many people
- enough + noun: enough time, enough chairs
- adjective/adverb + enough: old enough, clearly enough
- Common exam pattern: too + adjective + for someone + to + infinitive / adjective + enough + for someone + to + infinitive
